

## IFC's Exclusion List

1. Forced labor means all work or services, not voluntarily performed, that is extracted from an individual under threat of forced or penalty.
2. Harmful child labor means the employment of children that is economically exploitive, or is likely to be hazardous to, or to interfere with, the child's education, or to be harmful to the child's health, or physical, mental, spiritual, moral, or social development.
3. This does not apply to project sponsors who are not substantially involved in these activities. "Not substantially involved" means that the activity concerned is ancillary to a project sponsor's primary operations.
4. CITES: Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora. A list of CITES listed species is available from IFC's Environmental Division.
5. This does not apply to the purchase of medical equipment, quality control (measurement) equipment and any equipment where IFC considers the radioactive source to be trivial and/or adequately shielded.
6. This does not apply to the purchase and use of bonded asbestos cement sheeting where the asbestos contents is <20%
7. PCBs: Polychlorinated biphenyls- a group of highly toxic chemicals. PCBs are likely to be found in oil-filled electrical transformers, capacitors and switchgear dating from 1950-1985
